WHEREAS, the diagnostic radiology, interventional radiology, and radiation oncology residency programs at the University of Washington in Seattle are some of the most highly-regarded nationally, producing the next generation of imaging professionals to serve our region and beyond; and

WHEREAS, November 8, the anniversary of the discovery of the X-ray, is the International Day of Radiology, which this year is dedicated to emergency radiology;
