UW Radiology Research and Education Day is always an exciting event for the residents, along with their mentors, to present their research.





Rohrmann Endowment supports Board Review Courses for UW Radiology Residents

The Education Endowment Advisory Committee granted special permission this year supporting PGY4 residents who chose to attend a board review course. Due to travel restrictions this past year, the operating budget was able to support these study aids. The residents who participated share their gratitude:

"In preparation for the Canadian Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons diagnostic radiology certification examination, the Rohrmann Endowment allowed me to attend the University of Ottawa Radiology review course. Although content overlaps with review resources for the CORE, learning from experts from a different institution and nation has solidified concepts and reinvigorated interest and curiosity in topics I thought were already mastered. Radiology is an expansive world, and the Rohrmann Endowment has once again allowed me to experience more of it!"

"The NYRS Core Review is a series of pre-recorded lectures accessible starting in early May. The instructors said the lectures would only be available for two weeks, but they remained accessible until the test day in June. The highlight of the lectures was their brevity. Nearly all of the lectures were less than 25 minutes long, and many were less than 15 minutes. This was in contradistinction to AIRP, where the lectures were an hour long. The second highlight of the lectures was their case-based approach and strong alignment with the exam. On the negative side, the course did not provide a detailed review of physics.

I ended up watching about 90% of the lectures over the course of four weeks while walking my dog. These lectures were particularly helpful after I had already completed a number of question banks. The majority of the content was review, but certain topics were presented in a memorable way. Two worthy of mention were neuroradiology and Müllerian duct anomalies. It's difficult to cram neuroradiology. I did all of RadPrimer (which is mostly neuro), watched all of the CrackTheCore neuro lectures, and watched all of the AIRP neuro lectures. Despite these efforts, I still couldn't remember specific tumors/lesions, until I watched the NYRS neuro videos. They were easy to follow, and directly on-point with respect to the exam. The uterus lectures were similarly optimized for the test. Overall, I'd say that NYRS Core Review is good for a last-minute cramming because of its optimized brevity. It's a relatively quick way to check your knowledge for any glaring gaps, though it is by no means comprehensive. I am extremely grateful to the donors of the Rohrmann Endowment for supporting my participation in this course"

Rohrmann Endowment and Rohrmann Endowed Resident Education Funds Reach \$1 Million Goal!

Thanks to the generosity of UW Radiology faculty, alumni, and friends – all of you! The Charles A. Rohrmann, Jr., M.D., Endowment for Radiology Resident Educational Excellence, combined with the Rohrmann Endowment Education Funds,* has reached and exceeded the goal of \$1,000,000 – and today stands at \$1,007,123!

Progression of the Rohrmann Endowment Fund since its inception:

- 2010 Initiation of the campaign for the Rohrmann Endowment by Drs. Mary Kelly and Bill Shuman, with a vision to honor Dr. Charles Rohrmann for his teaching and guidance of the residents and to create a perpetual fund to support "resident education, research, and community service in the Department of Radiology" minimum funding requirement was \$125,000.
- Resident alumni, faculty, and colleagues raised \$134,000 over the course of 3 years, officially establishing the Endowment on March 27, 2013.
- April 2014: 12 UW Radiology Alumni formed the Advisory Committee which serves to this day by then the fund had grown to \$240,000!
- December 2019: Dr. William Shuman, one of the original founders of the Endowment, retired (now Emeritus Professor). Donors rallied to bring the fund to \$845,000.
- July 2020: Dr. Charles Rohrmann (now Emeritus Professor) retired from UW Radiology. Alumni classes challenged one another, faculty contributed, and donors from other UW Medicine departments all honored Dr. Rohrmann, edging the Endowment so close to the goal now \$967,600.
- May 2021: Just in time for the 4th Annual Lunch & Learn event the Rohrmann Endowment and Education principal funds reached and exceeded \$1,000,000!

Your donations have brought the Endowment past the \$1M goal supporting Educational Excellence! And, your continued support adds to the impact of this program through perpetuity. We extend our sincere gratitude to all for your generous donations to the Endowment.

What's Next?

Your generous gifts **continue to support** impactful residents' activities in 2021. Funding this Endowment continues to **strengthen** the research, educational, and – importantly, the new Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) initiatives for training underrepresented minorities and introducing students to the medical field and radiology careers.

Because this is an Endowment with perpetual income (currently returning 4.5%), your gift will keep giving to the Radiology Residency perpetually. The quality of their education has been and will continue to be directly impacted by these funds – which are available from no other source. Supporting this Endowment will ensure that our residents will have access to the leading-edge new educational technology, research support, and professional development opportunities that will prepare them for a strong future in Radiology.
